<u>O R D E R</u>

03.04.2018 Learned counsel for the appellant submits that the appellant has offered better amount which is approximately 100% of the dues to the Committee of Creditors. It will cover the claim of all the 'creditors' i.e. 'financial creditors', 'operational creditors', 'secured creditors' and 'unsecured creditors', as the case may be. There is a likelihood of settlement which may be reached between the appellant and the Committee of Creditors, which may be placed before the Kolkata Bench on the next date. Request has been made to adjourn the case as in number of cases the Hon'ble Supreme Court exercising its power under Article 142 of the Constitution of India has accepted the settlement. In

view of such statement we adjourn the case with liberty to the parties to reach settlement and if so required to move before appropriate Forum for appropriate relief.

Place the case 'for orders' on 19th April, 2018.
